


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

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Robert Swiderski was born in Warsaw, Poland, in 1971. "The years that followed were marked by the ever-decreasing amounts of food and liberties." His family fled to Munich, where they lived for three years, then immigrated to America. They soon settled in Chicago, which offered the largest Polish population in the world outside of Warsaw. Of interest there is St. Hyacinth Basilica, also known as "The Polish Cathedral."

Swiderski's early interest in photography began simply with the need for good family photos. His interest expanded, however, when the church announced a competition to photograph its architecture. This was new photographic territory for Swiderski, but he found it "challenging and surprisingly fulfilling." He won the competition.

His formal education includes a Bachelor's Degree in Business from DeVry University (Illinois); he considers "plain old life – with all its ups and downs" his informal education. While self-employed, he states that "the nature of my company has nothing to do with photography."

When he looks to the "greats" he enjoys the work of Henri Cartier-Bresson, Josef Sudek, and Steve McCurry. He is quick to point out that his wife, Klara, is instrumental in his photography. "We consider the work a 100% mutual effort." He adds that "Being hobbyists only, and frugal by nature, we own only one cheap camera; being a successful marriage, we know how to share."

Robert and Klara (along with their 10-pound Dachshund named Julia) live in Palatine, Illinois (a quiet suburban town near Chicago).

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Roman Loranc was born in Bielsko-Biala, a city in southwestern Poland, in 1956. His parents thought that he should be a food processor, so he earned the equivalent of a Bachelor's Degree in food processing from a technical university in Poland. He worked in food processing, but was always drawn to photography. At the age of 19 he traded a pair of jeans (a prized possession in postwar Poland) for a camera. With a small suitcase that served as a mobile developing station he was able to work anywhere. "I dabbled in it without ever thinking I could make my avocation my life's work; the lack of equipment and materials in Poland, along with the expense, discouraged me."

In 1981 Loranc left Poland and lived in Europe for a year. In 1982, at age 26, he immigrated to Madison, Wisconsin, and in 1985 settled in Modesto, California. There he worked as a truck driver, mortgage broker, and truck driving instructor before returning to the camera.

When his daughter, Lilly, began taking photography courses at a local community college, she inspired her father to reexamine his old fascination with photos and the darkroom. "Spending many contemplative and ecstatic hours fly-fishing on the banks of wild rivers with Chris, our son, convinced me I had to work outdoors." Again, it was his family who moved him towards his avocation: "My wife and children gave me the moral support I needed to undertake a risky exploration."

Loranc has read Ansel Adams on printing, studied the work of Edward Weston, and attended workshops with Morley Baer and John Sexton.

Volunteer restoration work at the San Luis National Wildlife Refuge and the Cosumnes Nature Conservancy Preserve allowed Loranc to appreciate the forgiving beauty of the Central Valley.



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

Nick Brandt

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
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Born in London in 1966, Nick Brandt was raised in England, where he studied painting and film at St. Martin School of Art in London.

In what he describes as "a previous incarnation in my twenties," he was an award-winning director of music videos and commercials for the likes of Michael Jackson and Moby. He no longer directs, and prefers to focus his energies and conversation on his photography.

Beyond formal education or training, Brandt feels that travelling to experience other cultures offers a tremendous sort of informal education.



Photographically, he enjoys the early pictorial work of Edward Steichen, stating that "my mouth waters every time I look at those photos."

Upcoming exhibits are scheduled at the Sandra Byron Gallery in Sydney, Australia (Oct 29 through Nov 23, 2005) and Camera Work Gallery in Berlin, Germany (Nov 26, 2005 through Jan 1, 2006).

Brandt lives with his wife, Orla, "and a menagerie of adopted animals" in Topanga Canyon (west of Los Angeles).
